This letter is to advise the Organization of the U.S. implementation plan to prepare U.S. flagged vessels trading internationally for the pending entry into force of MARPOL 73/78 Annex IV. Although MARPOL 73/78 Annex IV has not been ratified by the United States, United States flagged vessels on international voyages and sailing in the waters of countries that have adopted MARPOL 73/78 Annex IV may need to demonstrate compliance with MARPOL 73/78 Annex IV requirements.

All U.S. vessels sailing internationally to countries signatory to MARPOL 73/78 Annex IV, should have an installed and operational U.S. Coast Guard approved Marine Sanitation Device (MSD) which meets the criteria of 33 Code of Federal Regulations Part 159. The U.S. Coast Guard considers Coast Guard approved MSDs to be equivalent to MARPOL 73/78 Annex IV requirements.

Since the United States is not a party to MARPOL 73/78 Annex IV, the U.S. Coast Guard cannot issue official international convention certificates as a Flag State. However, in order to facilitate commerce and reduce confusion, the U.S. Coast Guard will issue a document certifying equivalent compliance with MARPOL 73/78 Annex IV. As an alternative, The Coast Guard may permit Authorized Classification Societies to issue Statements of Voluntary Compliance to vessels that met the provisions of MARPOL 73/78 Annex IV.
